SUBJECT TITLE: Maintenance of Lith Lane

PURPOSE OF REPORT: The residents at Lith Lane have requested that we carry out works on the track and they will pay for the material.

Areas of the track have worn away again since we filled the pot holes last Autumn and some could be filled to improve the surface. I can only imagine it will get a lot worse over winter once the heavy rains come.

Logistically this job is difficult for HPC staff to carry out. I am concerned where we would store the stone at Catherington Lith. Lorrys would dump in large quantities and I am not sure how practical or feasible this is for us without the use of heavy plant machinery to move the material quickly. After last autumns accident I would not recommend we collect and move stone to site.

Another concern if council agreed to the works is staffing levels within the Countryside Team. We are short staffed at the moment and a project like this would be a big one for us to undertake in planning and delivery.

For reference, Catternhorn did quote for the works last year. For Catterhorn to carry out resurfacing work it would have cost £3260 + Vat.

The plan was to lay approximately 40 tonne of new type 1 MOT (crushed concrete) onto the track and roller it in.

Looking at last year's Purchase order, 4 tonnes of type 1 cost £98.40 ex Vat. Circa £1000 for 40 tonnes.
