Crime Prevention advice for the holiday season



Online shopping securely

At this time of year online shopping can be convenient and save you time - but make sure you take steps to protect yourself. These three tips from the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) will help you <u>shop online safely</u> this festive season.



Could your smart device be hacked?

Smart devices are electrical items that connect to the internet (or to your home network), usually via Wi-Fi. Unlike conventional electrical items, there is a risk that they can be hacked into.

Keep your device updated to help keep it secure. When you first use the device, set up a new secure password, and use 2-step verification where possible.

Avoid buying devices that are no longer supported by the manufacturer, as they will be easier to hack into.
